

SUFFOLK'S HEALTH CRISIS

What is going on? local MP David Ruffley 'speaks out'

he state of Suffolk's health service has led Bury St Edmunds MP David Ruffley to hold a crisis meeting.

Local clergy and members of the public have met with David Ruffley at Christ Church, Moreton Hall, Bury St Edmunds to discuss cuts to services in our area.

The latest figures obtained by David show that Health Trusts in Suffolk are to end the 2005/06 financial year with a deficit approaching £50 million.


David said: "The health service in Suffolk is facing a full-on crisis. Beds are being cut and vital facilities are scheduled to close. My meeting with local clergy highlighted the very real concern, felt across Suffolk, that the NHS in Suffolk will face cutbacks of services.

"Mental Health facilities are threatened and trusts have been threatened with fines for failing to balance their books! This is money that could otherwise be spent on patient care.

"It is simply scandalous that we will only be receiving 82 percent of the national average funding per head of the population in 2006/07.

"I will continue to fight for a better deal for Suffolk health care."

Bury MP David Ruffley, demanded a high level meeting with Hazel Blears, Minister of State at the Home Office, to discuss London's changes to Suffolk's police force.

Ministers are forcing Suffolk Constabulary to merge with the poorly performing forces in Cambridgeshire and Norfolk.

David said: "This is bad news. I and others have long argued that these mergers

will be incredibly expensive, disruptive and not necessarily deliver savings.

"London Ministers are forcing these reforms through against the advice of a report carried out by their own department.

"This merger could lead to Suffolk taxpayers paying for second rate services as officers are forced to police crime hot spots such as Peterborough. It is yet another ridiculous piece of bureaucratic nonsense from the Civil Servants in the corridors of Whitehall, many of whom are completely out of touch with rural communities such as Suffolk."

Extra £2 million bill for A14 Rookery Crossroads

Delays to the Rookery Crossroads Scheme on the A14 could cost taxpayers £2million. And it was not finished on time.

Will the big works to start at the Haughley Bends go the same way?

David Ruffley MP has demanded answers over the delays and spiralling costs from national Highways Agency boss, Archie Robertson.

David said: "The opening of the Rookery Crossroads was a very welcome day. I had been campaigning for these vital road safety improvements since my election in 1997. But, the taxpayers have every right to question the delays to this project and the spiralling costs that resulted.

"I have written to Archie Robertson, Chief Executive of the Highways

Agency, asking for an explanation for why the project was completed six months late and reportedly £2 million over budget. I have also sought his assurance that everything will be done to ensure future projects on our County's main trunk road, such as the proposed improvements to the Haughley Bends, will be better managed and arrive on time and at their projected cost.

"These improvements were vital to road safety but when a project is completed six months late and well over budget questions have to be asked of those in charge."

"With me, my constituents come first. If you ever feel you need my help, please do get in touch. I'll do what I can to assist you and your family."
